



Hot Tubs and Swim Spas **Winterizing Instructions**

If you don't plan on using your Hot Tub over the winter months, then it's an excellent idea to winterize it. This minimizes the risk of damage from freezing water. Our service staff are able to come out and do it for you, or you can follow these steps to do it yourself.

1. We recommend first cleaning the tub with a bio cleaner like AHH-Some, this reduces any bacteria growth that might occur while the tub is empty.
2. Drain the tub with either the built-in drain function or with a submersible pump, make sure to get as much water out as possible. A soft broom helps to get water out of the seats and step in area.
3. With either an air compressor or air blower, blow air into all of the jets, forcing as much water out as possible. Make sure to start at the top jets first and work your way down. Any excess water should be removed with either towels or a wet vacuum.
4. Using RV anti-freeze (usually the pink stuff) and a funnel, fill as many jets as you can until it flows out. Don't forget any waterfalls, filter canisters, or self-draining ice buckets. The more the better, any water left in the lines should be diluted enough to not freeze.
5. Lastly, latch the cover in place and install either a Cover Cap or a tarp around the whole Hot Tub. The lower the better, this will prevent any snow or rain water from getting up and under the cover skirts and freezing inside the Hot Tub.
